Homeland security market to grow by half

U.S. homeland security spending will rise by half over the next five years, with a lot of the growth coming from the private sector, a recent report says.

Earlier this month research published by the Homeland Security Research Corp., a Washington-based business consultancy, showed that total 2006 spending on U.S. homeland security was \$23.8 billion, forecasted to rise to \$34.8 billion a year by 2011.

About half that annual total spending is expected to come from the Department of Homeland Security, while roughly a third is from other government agencies or departments and the remainder from the private sector, the report said.

Private sector spending is forecasted to show the strongest growth, from \$4.8 billion annually to \$6.7 billion by 2011.
